

## Part 2: Schedule of Dates

### 1 Introduction

There is a very specific timetable of events for the elections. All the major instances listed below will be addressed in the documents later in this series.

### 2 Key Dates leading up to election

#### 2.1 Notification of Elections: 15 Jan 2007

The official notice that the elections are to take place. Usually one week prior to any formal activity.

#### 2.2 Nominations Open: 29 Jan 2007

Candidates can obtain all the briefing material (in the candidate's pack) required to run in an election. Nominations can be taken from this point on, up until the close of nominations.

#### 2.3 Close of Nominations: 19 Feb 2007, 6pm

The final day that prospective candidates can hand in their nomination forms, publicity material, manifestos and questions.

#### 2.4 Candidates meeting: 22 Feb 2007, 4.30pm

A mandatory meeting to brief the candidates of scope of responsibilities that come with the role. With addresses from the Vice Chancellor of the University.

#### 2.5 Publicity to be distributed: 5 Mar 2007

All posters etc. to be erected in nominated positions by the beginning of the week. Publicity can be collected from the Copy Shop from 10 a.m.

#### 2.6 Question time / Hustings: 5 Mar – 9 Mar 2007

An opportunity for the candidates to present their manifestos to students, and to be questioned on specific points. The week will be divided as follows, with all events commencing at 7pm in the Waterhole.

- Student Support                      Monday 27 Feb
- Activities and Development        Tuesday 28 Feb
- Sports Officer                         Wednesday 01 Mar
- Media & Publications                Thursday 02 Mar
- President                                Friday 03 Mar

#### 2.7 Campaign Week: 12 Mar – 16 Mar 2007

Candidates use this time immediately prior to, and during, the elections to pass their message onto the voting public.

#### 2.8 Voting: 14 Mar – 16 Mar 2007

Voting takes place at several sites around the University, including the Students' Union. Voting ceases at 1pm Friday

**2.9 Counting: 16 Mar 2007**

Counting commences after voting in accordance with the rules outlined in Schedule 5 of the Constitution (The Rules for the Conduct of Elections). Announcement of winners takes place as soon as a satisfactory result is obtained.
