

Union Council Motion: Equality of Access to Dance Studios in Nuffield Sports Centre for Dance Societies

The Union believes:

- That dance-based societies are unable to have equal access to the dance studios in the Nuffield Sports Centre due to their classification as a society as opposed to a club
- Dance societies are in the same position as the Dance Club as they do not compete
- Dance Club have to pay cheaper rates to hire the dance studios than the dance societies are quoted due to their classification as being a UPSU club

The Union further believes:

- The three main dance societies this year (Street Salsa, Breakdancing and Latino Dance Cocktail) have all been very active societies and have high numbers of active members
- The two of the three societies mentioned often provide classes outside of university premises as they find it cheaper than the fees that the university's Nuffield Sports Centre charge for the hire of the dance studios for the same period of time
- Clubs and societies should be treated as equals

The Union resolves:

1. To lobby the directors of the Nuffield Sports Centre to enable the provision of access to the dance studios for dance based societies for the same charges that are quoted to UPSU sports clubs
2. Societies should be treated on an equal basis to sports clubs when it comes to the hiring of dance studios for the purposes of training
